

A WEEK IN PARIS MAY 1-8, 2014

We are delighted to be returning to Paris this spring. If you have never been to the CITY OF LIGHT, or wish to return, this is the trip for you! Our always-spectacular EXCURSION to Paris will include comprehensive sightseeing as well as free time to wander on your own. We have included the city's grand monuments as well as an abundant sampling of her splendid museums. Special tours will give us an opportunity to enjoy the architecture, sculpture, parks and avenues of one of the world's most beautiful cities. A highlight will be an excursion to see Impressionist painter Claude Monet's home and gardens at GIVERNY. Optional evening events will be arranged to ensure you have the richest possible experience throughout your stay. Accommodations are at the wonderfully located HOTEL DU LOUVRE.

<u>THURSDAY, MAY 1</u> – Early evening departure from Philadelphia, or your home city, to Paris. Dinner and breakfast will be served aboard the airplane.

<u>FRIDAY, MAY 2</u> — Upon arrival at Charles de Gaulle Airport, transfer to the **HOTEL DU LOUVRE** conveniently located amidst Paris' most exciting landmarks, museums and shops. Enjoy an orientation tour of the neighborhood this afternoon and a welcome dinner this evening.

<u>SATURDAY, MAY 3</u> — Our sightseeing this morning will include the great monuments of Paris: the PLACE DE LA CONCORDE and stately TUILERIES GARDENS; and the opulent PARIS OPERA HOUSE, designed in the Second Empire style by Charles Garnier. The bustling CHAMPS-ELYSÉES ends at the ARC DE TRIOMPHE, commemorating Napoleon's victory at the Battle of Austerlitz. We will stop at the EIFFEL TOWER, centerpiece of the 1889 International Exposition, visit NAPOLEON'S TOMB and stroll through the magnificent LUXEMBOURG GARDENS in the heart of the Latin Quarter. Lunch is included prior to a visit to ST. CHAPELLE with its beautiful stained glass, and the great gothic CATHEDRAL OF NOTRE DAME.

NOTE: OPTIONS WILL BE OFFERED FOR EACH FREE EVENING FOR DINING AND PERFORMING ARTS EVENTS INCLUDING CONCERTS, BALLET, OPERA AND JAZZ WHEN AVAILABLE.

SUNDAY, MAY 4 – Enjoy a morning walking tour in the charming MARAIS. Stroll around the PLACE DES VOSGES, the city's oldest square. At the PLACE DE LA BASTILLE we will recall the birthplace of the French Revolution in 1789. In the afternoon you can visit the PICASSO MUSEUM, which contains the artist's collection of his own works and his personal collection of paintings by Matisse, Renoir, Braque and Rousseau; HOTEL CARNAVALET (historical Museum of the City of Paris), or the fascinating MUSEUM OF HISTORY AND ART OF JUDAISM.

MONDAY, MAY 5 – Today is free to explore Paris on your own. MUSÉE D'ORSAY, the former turn of the 19th century train station now houses an extraordinary collection of 19th century art; the wondrous CENTRE GEORGES POMPIDOU, one of the most important collections of modern art in the world; and the ancient HOTEL DU CLUNY with its fine collection of French Medieval art; are all open on Mondays. Today might also be a great day for shopping or a trip to VERSAILLES or CHARTRES.

<u>TUESDAY, MAY 6</u> – This morning we have planned a tour to some of Paris' exceptional small museums: **LE MUSÉE NISSIM DE COMMANDO**, appointed with 18th century tapestries, porcelain and furniture. and the **MUSÉE JACQUEMART-ANDRÉ**, a late 19th century townhouse, housing the collections of Eduoard André and his wife Nellie. Included are treasures of the Italian Renaissance, the Flemish Masters, and the 18th century French School. Optional lunch is planned in the charming café at the **MUSÉE JACQUEMART-ANDRÉ**.

<u>WEDNESDAY, MAY 7</u> — This morning we will travel thirty miles outside of Paris for a tour of the home and Gardens of Claude Monet in **GIVERNY** which should be in gorgeous bloom at the beginning of May, and the nearby **MUSÉE DES IMPRESSIONISTES** housing the work of minor French Impressionists and American artists who worked in France, including Sergeant, Whistler, Homer and more. After lunch on our own in the town of Giverny we will return to Paris for some free time before an included dinner celebrating our final night in Paris.

<u>THURSDAY, MAY 8</u> – If you are returning home today we will make arrangements for you to return to the airport. Additional nights at the **HOTEL DU LOUVRE** are available upon request.

<u>TOUR COST</u>: The cost for land arrangements is **\$2625**. The single supplement is **\$960**. We will make every effort to arrange for a compatible roommate if you are interested.
